**Man Of War**

*Man Of Wars are the true terror of the Caribbean. Incredibly tough and well-armed, they can take down whole ships single-handedly.*

**Armament:**

16-50 cannons, Rammer, Fire Barrels, Naval Mortar, Chain Shot, Heavy Shot



**Frigate**

*The backbone of any naval force, the Frigate is a well-rounded vessel that combines good speed and agility with impressive offensive and defensive capabilities.*

**Armament:**

24 - 46 cannons, Heavy Shot



**Brig**

*The Brig is a fast attack ship that uses a Rammer to finish off damaged enemies. In a fleet, they are used for flanking tactics.*

**Armament:**

24 cannons, Rammer



**Schooner**

*A cowardly ship that plays the support role in a fleet, scouting ahead and trapping enemy forces with Fire Barrels.*

**Armament:**

6 - 8 cannons, Fire barrels



**Gunboat**

*Small and nimble, the Gunboat is a support vessel that is used as a screening force to larger battle fleets.*

**Armament:**

2 cannons



**Jackdaw**

*The Jackdaw, Edward Kenway's ship, is the jack-of-all-trades of the high seas. With a skilled captain at its helm, it has the potential to utilize any tactics.*

**Armament:**

16-50 cannons, Rammer, Fire Barrels, Naval Mortar, Chain Shot, Heavy Shot







**USS Pennsylvania** was a four-decked 140-gun ship of the line of the United States Navy, named for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. She was the largest sailing warship ever built for the United States, the equivalent of a first-rate of the British Royal Navy. Authorized in 1816 and launched in 1837, her only cruise was a single trip from Delaware Bay through Chesapeake Bay to the Norfolk Navy Yard.

She remained there until 20 April 1861 when she was burned to the waterline to prevent her falling into Confederate hands. (Wikipedia)
